Chou Tai-Chun was born in 1986 in Hsinchu, Taiwan. He received his MFA degree with a specialization in painting from the Taipei National University of the Arts in 2012. From the earlier series "Globe Silent" and "Beyond the Silence" to his later 2018 series "Back to" and "Beyond the Mountains", Chou Tai-Chun has been gradually constructing a unique visual experience and imaginary space reflecting on the modern era. Environmental issues are a recurring theme in his paintings and installations. He conveys his unique perspective on this topic through a science-fictional depiction of the seemingly otherworldly landscape. The alienation and unfamiliarity in his visual representations alludes to the current problems we are facing in this planet.

Ho Kan 霍剛


Ho Kan was born in Nanjing, China in 1932. He graduated from Taipei Teacher's School Department of Art in 1953. As a member of "Tong Fan Art Group," Ho Kan was extremely influential to the development of modern art in Taiwan in 1960s. Ho Kan went on to study in Milan, and his style gradually shifted to geometric abstraction. Ho Kan integrates Eastern calligraphy and seal carving art to develop his unique Eastern abstract painting of a minimalist yet poetic style. He started from the most simple both global elements of, \triangle , \Box , and \bigcirc , and created his own philosophy about the arrangement of image and shape, which validated the essential existence of each element. His painting also transformed from the early experimental and melancholic style to his recent style that is more vivid and vibrant. Ho Kan introduced the method of reduction in his abstraction; his rendering is equally minimalistic as poetic. Ho Kan remains one of Taiwan's most important abstract painters.



Hsiao Chin 蕭勤

Hsiao Chin was born in Shanghai in 1935 and moved to Taiwan in 1949. He graduated from the Fine Arts Department of the National Taiwan Normal University in 1955 under the teachings of Chu Teh-Chun as well as Li Chun-Sen. A radical of the period, Hsiao was part of the Ton-Fan Art Group, commonly hailed the "Eight Bandits" or the "Eight Great Outlaws" due to their opposition to the government which resisted all forms of the avant-garde. Greatly inspired by nature whilst striving for spontaneity in artistic gestures balancing fullness and emptiness, Hsiao Chin and his peers would quickly assimilate and above all interpret it to freely express their own identity. By the mid-1950's, Hsiao was awarded the Spanish Government Scholarship to study in Spain and soon established himself amongst the highest caliber of his contemporaries. In the late 1950s, Hsiao created Pintura-AO and Pintura Q, representing a transition from geometric abstraction and marking his particular reinterpretation of the early 20th century art movement. The aforementioned paintings are exemplars of this period, with a limited primary color palette generously applied in broad expanses to the canvas. Concurrently, Hsiao's reconditioning of motifs and calligraphic roots in his home culture and translated as closed forms, composed on a flat pictorial space.

By the mid-1960's Hsiao Chin became increasingly interested in representing the infinite. He captured the cosmos in his minimalistic works, limited in their range of colors and utilizing regular forms. Visually mediating the two forms are speckled indigo contours and circular forms, rendering the sublime with nominal devices. Drawing on spiritual symbols shared by Eastern and Western civilizations, his works visualize ideologies and seek to refine representations of beauty with pure simplicity. Starting in 1960's, Hsiao founded several important modern art movements in Europe, including the Movimento Punto (1961), the Surya Movement (1977), and the Shaki movement (1989). Upon losing his only daughter to an accident in 1990, Hsiao had an epiphany, reconciling, accepting and perceiving the Taoist philosophies of "rebirth."



Hu Chau-Tsung 胡朝聰

Hu Chau-Tsung was born in 1981 in Taipei, Taiwan. He received his MFA from the Taipei National University of the Arts in 2017. Hu's creative inspiration arises from his personal experiences and practices. The greatest source of inspiration for him, also a place to frequently visit, is the border between cities and nature. The border of the city, the most elusive location of all, is the place where he chases the memories of his youth days. Hu captures the outlines of the borders in real life and geographic sites, which he combines with personal experiences and delicate gradation of colors, to paint ambiguous areas.

Hu has been continuously focusing on observing and researching the symbiosis of humanity and nature. In his artworks, Hu is aiming to express the common boundary of a natural environment and artificial scene – a vague, ambiguous and untouchable relationship, as well as a penetrating and contradictory sense of space. Obscure, ambiguous, indefinable and constantly changing cross-borders in Hu's paintings create a larger space for imagination, allowing the audience to reflect on their own memories and experiences in regards to living naturally. Starting with the cross-borders, space and the sense of belonging as a foundation for his explorations, Hu has also derived a discussion of "residence" and "place" from the approach to the relationship between people and land.




Huang Hai-Hsin was born in Taipei in 1984 and received her BA degree from National Taipei University of Education in 2007. In 2009 she received an MFA from The School of Visual Arts in New York. Huang Hai-Hsin's works explore images indicative of the contemporary life. Particularly banal everyday life scenes can reveal an ambiguous atmosphere between humor and horror. She takes inspiration from ordinary family photos, tourists at attraction sites, visitors at museums, and the routine disaster drills. In her work, most aspects of life have the potential to be ridiculous, absurd, awkward, funny, and meaningless at the same time. Her creational process invites viewers to cast doubt on authority and the standardization of taste.



Su Wong-Shen was born in 1956 in Puzi, Chiayi County, Taiwan. He graduated from Taipei Cultural University Department of Art in 1979. Su's earlier style was influenced by abstract expressionism. After 1988, his work started to incorporate iconographic symbols, social phenomenonand textures. He became known for balancing habitable and playable perceptual spaces with rational allegory and calm tones. Su's work often expressed sentiment for his homeland. Dogs and Cats are reappearing subjects in his paintings. The images of stray animals represent Su's earliest childhood memories growing up on the island of Taiwan. His later rendering of animals became less figurative. Via the actions and composition of animals, Su brings the relationship between human beings and their environment to a metaphoric and poetic level.

Born in 1979 in Yunlin, Taiwan, Wang Liang-Yin received her MFA from Taipei National University of the Arts. 

Yang Mao-Lin 楊茂林

Born in 1953 in Changhua, Taiwan, Yang Mao-Lin graduated from the Fine Arts Department of China Culture University in 1979. Yang Mao-Lin was a founding member and the first president of the Taipei School of Painting in 1985. In the early days of his creation through Taiwan's turbulent 1980s, he broke through taboos and showed a strongly critical attitude. Brimming with tension, the exhilarating style of his paintings subtly corresponds to the realities of political and social transformation before and after the martial law in Taiwan in the 1980s. In the 1990s, after the "post-reliance", in the face of the gradual formation of global-ization, the entanglement between internationalization and localization was more complicated, and the focus of Yang Mao-Lin's creation changed from political action to socio-economical aspects of the society. He then first started to use the title "MADE IN TAIWAN" to try to explore the possibilities of artistic forms and subject matter from the perspective of Taiwan's politics, history, and culture.


