





Since 2005, the Chinese artist Liu Bolin has been mastering the art of invisibility by concealing himself completely in his own work. Bolin began to portray himself as an "invisible man" in Beijling after government officials forced the closure of his studio nine years ago. Ever since, he has used his work as a form of silent protest. Rather than relying on digital manipulation, the artist paints his entire body to blend into a background. The painstaking procedure can take up to 10 hours, but, once finished, he claims that even passers-by fail to spot him.

Bolin's first solo exhibition in Britain, The Heroic Apparition, is at the Scream gallery, London WIW, until May 10.
